If you are planning to move away from the Forest Park area this summer, or are transferring your children to another school next year, please advise the office as soon as possible. Your cooperation greatly assists us in determining our numbers and school organization for the 2015-16 school year.

### SEPTEMBER START-UP

The first day of school is often a time of great excitement for students, staff and families. As educators we also look forward to September opening with a great deal of excitement and anticipation. With enrollment uncertainties experienced in recent years, the reality is that student class placement often takes several days. This is especially true when a school experiences growth or reduction in enrollment and, or when staffing has not been finalized. It is our intention to settle into routines with as little disruption as possible.

This year, students will attend for only one hour on Tuesday, September 8th, from 11:00 am to 12:00 pm. Students will then attend for a full day on Wednesday, September 9th. On Tuesday morning we will ask all Grade 1 - 7 students to meet in the gym for a short assembly before we move to classrooms to do attendance and go over how the week will be organized. Throughout this first week students will work in same grade groups and in cross-grade groups as we re-connect with each other. Staff members will carefully check the attendance, add to the list new registrations, and determine final student placements for 2015/16. We are anticipating that we will not be assigning students to their classes until the Monday morning of the next week.

Parents of Kindergarten students will receive a letter of welcome in the mail in August with specific

information about your child's first day in attendance and the gradual entry program at Forest Park School. Our teachers are looking forward to meeting all of our new Forest Park School students in September. Please note that Kindergarten students do not attend school on September 8<sup>th</sup>.


## TENTATIVE SCHOOL ORG. 2015/16


