#### HOLIDAY CRAFT NIGHT

#### SECURITY PROTOCOL:

Ensuring safety for all students and school personnel is very important to us at Forest Park School. To that end, adults visiting our school are required to report to the office first, sign in the visitor's book and obtain an 'Authorized Visitor' pass from our secretary. This information is essential as it enables us to quickly determine the nature and length of your visit and account for all adults within the building in case of an emergency situation. Please remember to always report to the office first upon arriving to school, even if you are well known to the office staff. Thank you for your anticipated cooperation with this very important safety concern.

#### TRAFFIC SAFETY - PARKING LOT

Anyone driving children to Forest Park is well aware of our daily traffic challenges. Drivers are urged to exercise extreme caution at all times in the parking lot as well as the drop off/pick up area. Congestion at peak times (arrival, dismissal) means children must occasionally walk between cars. Please be extra vigilant when pulling in, backing out or driving through. Motorists are reminded NOT to stop in the fire lanes or in the drop off/pick up zone in front of the school.

In addition, please remember to be conscious and aware of our neighbours. Please avoid blocking driveways and creating congestion in our residential areas.

One more reminder about parking, please only use the Handicap Parking spaces at the front of the school if you have a legal handicap parking sign as

these spaces are reserved for families needing this service.

Thank you for your cooperation! We all know the parking is a challenge but with everyone's cooperation we can make it work.

#### LICE

As we progress through the school year we would like to take this time to give parents some information about head lice if they are in need to check. Head lice do not carry disease, nor do they mean your child is dirty. Please contact the school if you find any head lice during these checks.

#### How do you check for head lice?

To confirm a case of head lice, you need to find live lice. Children can have a few nits without actually having a case of head lice. Usually children have no more than 10 to 20 live lice.

- Good lighting is important when you are checking.
- Head lice move fast and are hard to see. They are usually found very close to the scalp, at the bottom of the neck and behind the ears.
- To look for nits, part hair in small sections, moving from one side to the other. Check carefully, looking close to the scalp.

#### SCHOOL CLOSURES:

It is that time of year again, when the school district would like to remind parents about school closure procedures. The most common reasons that schools might be closed are dangerous road conditions due to a heavy snowfall or ice.

If you are wondering if schools are open on a particular day, listen to local radio stations (WAVE 102.3 FM and WOLF 106.9 FM) in the mornings.

We also attempt to put an announcement of any school closures on the school district website, <u>www.sd68.bc.ca</u>, and on Twitter and Facebook, but our ability to do so could be affected by such things as power outages and technical issues. If there is no announcement on the website or social media, please be sure to listen to local radio stations.

We would like to remind parents that it is their right to make the final decision as to whether it is safe for their children to travel to school on any given day. While the district strives to make the best decision possible for students across the district, there may be circumstances in your neighbourhood that lead you to decide to keep your children home, even though schools are open.

#### PAC MEETINGS

These monthly meetings are open to all our parents of the Forest Park School community. It is an excellent opportunity to provide your input and suggestions on matters concerning educational issues and provide support to the programs and activities at the school. Child minding is provided at all our meetings, which are held on the second Tuesday of the month. November's meeting is on Tuesday, November 14<sup>th</sup>. Meetings begin at 7:00 p.m. in the library.
